OpenLearn Create, developed by The Open University (UK), is a free platform for creating, sharing and adapting Open Educational Resources (OER). It supports inclusive education, including learners with Specific Learning Disorders, and hosts collections that promote understanding of learning differences, such as Dyslexia Scotland and DyslexicU.

Target Audience

- 📖 Educators, teachers and youth workers who want to use open learning resources.
- 🏫 Schools and local authorities on inclusive practice.

Benefits of this tool

- 📖 Provides free access to hundreds of open online courses on various topics, including inclusion, dyslexia, and inclusive education.
- 📖 Supports personalised learning through self-paced courses and multimodal resources (videos, audio, quizzes, and text).

Additional Considerations

- ✓ **Multilingual support:** available in English.
- ✓ **Cost considerations:** the online learning modules are free of charge.
- ✓ **Technical requirements:** it is an online resource, so learners need access to a device such as a computer, tablet or smartphone with internet connection.
- ✓ **Adaptations for DYS-users:** promotes inclusive and multi-sensory teaching approaches to support learners with dyslexia, acknowledging co-occurrence with other support needs. These include visual supports, audio support, accessible digital resources.



How to Use with Youth

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Visit the website: <https://www.crazygames.com/t/word> and create a free account or browse without registering; explore existing courses;

Practice time:
In the search bar, type the topic you're interested in – for example, dyslexia.

Next, choose your preferred course and explore the toolkit for teachers, schools and local authorities on inclusive practice, literacy difficulties and dyslexia. The Toolkit guides users through a child-centred, collaborative process of identification, assessment, support and monitoring of dyslexia.
