- Parents:** Founded by parents to support other families with children who have dyslexia or other learning difficulties.
- Social workers:** professionals working with diverse learners.
- Youth:** particularly those with specific learning difficulties.

### Additional Considerations

## How to Use with Youth

- 1 Establish cooperation with the association to access expertise, resources, and guidance on dyslexia and learning difficulties.
- 2 Organize awareness workshops for youth to promote understanding, inclusion, and empathy among peers.
- 3 Provide tailored support activities, such as mentoring, non-formal learning sessions, or skills-building workshops adapted to different learning needs.
- 4 Engage youth in advocacy actions, encouraging them to speak up for inclusive education and equal opportunities.
